On the southern headlands of Watamu, where the open sea meets Mida Creek and Whale Island commands the horizon, you'll find Kusini — a luxurious Swahili-style villa set within three acres of oceanfront indigneous forest.


The house comfortably accommodates up to ten adults and two children in six air-conditioned bedrooms. Days are spent by the pool or in the warm, salty ocean in your own secluded cove within Kenya's richest marine national park.

Baby blacktip reef sharks glide through the shallows and

flocks of curlew sandpipers and sanderlings fill the sky.

Here, every moment captivates the senses, invigorates the heart, and nourishes the soul.












Meandering garden tunnels lead through endemic scrub forest to ochre-hued cliffs, the cove and its magical seashore.







Never still, the forest is home to birds, monitor lizards, hedgehogs, insects, tiny suni antelope and cheeky samango monkeys.



With its shaded baraza seating area, bar and a dining table fit for a sultan, the stylish pool terrace is the ideal location for long leisurely meals and afternoon siestas on Swahili daybeds.






The 50-foot lap pool featuring a child-friendly shallow ledge is shaded in the afternoon. When all is quiet, resident pied kingfishers come to bathe and samango monkeys forage among the branches of the surrounding trees.





The design of the elegant roof terrace is a nod to local Arabic influences. From here, you can spot dolphin in the morning, while in the evening it is the ultimate place for sundowners and bitings as you watch dhows glide gracefully back into the shimmering Mida channel.

















Central to the house is a wind funnel that enhances airflow, bringing a sense of spaciousness and light to every level.

The interiors feature high ceilings and generous windows and doors that frame stunning ocean views. A homely and spacious sitting room offers the perfect retreat for watching a movie or cooling off in the gentle trade winds that drift through the house.







The team of seven staff attending to all your needs includes a private chef whose prawn linguine, ginger crab and seared tuna are just three of his many signature dishes.

Sea View Room | 2nd Floor | Master



Neptune occupies much of the second floor, giving it complete privacy. The room has a king-size double bed, a spacious sitting room and study adorned with vibrant rugs and fabrics, and a large outdoor terrace. There is an adjoining children's room (Pluto) suitable for two children up to 12 years old.

Jupiter comes to life when the sun dips below the horizon, painting the creek and surrounding trees in pinks and golds. There is a private balcony and baraza seating overlooking a courtyard.

Situated on the ground floor, Earth is a stunning and spacious room that can transform into a family suite. At the front, it leads straight onto the pool and a laid-back baraza area, while to the rear, there is a courtyard filled with pots and palms.
